



Methodology Note for Disclosure of Contributions to Patient Organisations 2025

Countries: Denmark, Norway, Sweden and Finland

Data year: 2025

Disclosure year: 2026

Language/version: English Nordic version

Scope: Patient Organisations only

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1 Purpose and scope

This methodology note describes how Norgine identifies, calculates and discloses contributions, support and any services to Patient Organisations in Denmark, Norway, Sweden and Finland for the 2025 data year.

For this note, a Patient Organisation means a not-for-profit legal person or entity mainly composed of patients and/or caregivers and representing or supporting the needs of patients and/or caregivers.

This note applies only to Patient Organisations. Transfers of value to healthcare professionals (HCPs), healthcare organisations (HCOs) and healthcare professional associations are covered by Norgine's separate HCP/HCO methodology notes.

2 What is disclosed for 2025

Norgine discloses the name and country of the Patient Organisation, a short description of the contribution or collaboration, and the amount or value transferred or otherwise provided for the benefit of the organisation during the reporting period.

The disclosure covers direct and indirect transfers of value where the recipient or actual beneficiary is an identifiable Patient Organisation. This may include financial support, project support, sponsorship, payment for agreed services or material non-financial support, where relevant.

Norgine does not include ordinary internal costs, general dialogue with no financial or material non-financial support, or commercial purchases at fair market value that do not constitute support or another reportable transfer of value.

3 Method for identification and calculation

Data sources and control

The reported transfer of value has been identified based on relevant internal data sources, including agreement or project documentation, purchase order, invoice, payment data and local transparency input. Data has been reviewed before publication for recipient, country, amount, description and appropriate reporting treatment.

Reporting period

The reporting period is 1 January 2025 to 31 December 2025. Norgine generally reports based on the date of payment or other actual transfer of value. Where an activity and payment fall in different calendar years, reporting may therefore follow the payment year.

Amounts, currency and VAT

Amounts are reported in the local currency of the recipient country unless the relevant disclosure table states otherwise. If an original payment was made in another currency, Norgine converts the amount in accordance with the applicable Norgine currency conversion method for the relevant transaction.

Amounts are generally reported excluding VAT and other recoverable taxes where these are separately identifiable and deductible. If VAT or local taxes are included in an amount and cannot reasonably be separated, the gross amount may be disclosed.

Direct, indirect and cross-border transfers

Direct transfers are reported against the Patient Organisation that receives or benefits from the transfer. Indirect transfers via a third party are reported against the Patient Organisation where Norgine knows or can reasonably identify the actual beneficiary organisation.

Cross-border transfers are assigned to the country in which the Patient Organisation is registered, incorporated or has its primary place of operation, or otherwise to the country in which the transfer is required to be included in the local disclosure.

4 Publication and availability

The disclosure and this methodology note are made available online on Norgine's public website and/or Norgine's relevant European transparency page. Where Norgine is subject to a local requirement to notify or submit a link to a local industry association or platform, this is handled in accordance with that requirement; otherwise no separate local industry association submission is made.

The information is published within the EFPIA disclosure period for the preceding calendar year and is made available for at least three years, or for any longer period required by applicable local requirements or Norgine's internal record retention standards.

The disclosure relates to legal entities/organisations. Any personal data processed in connection with identifying, documenting or contacting representatives of Patient Organisations is handled in accordance with applicable data protection rules. Norgine does not disclose unnecessary personal identifiers.
